# Districting Process

Step	Description
<b>Two Initial Hearings</b> Feb. 26 & March 26 ✓	Held prior to release of draft maps. Education and to solicit input on the composition of districts.
<b>Release draft maps</b> April 23 ✓	Maps must be posted at least 7 days prior to 3 <sup>rd</sup> hearing.
<b>Two hearings on draft maps</b> April 30 & May 28 ✓	Two meetings to discuss and revise the draft maps and to discuss the election sequence.
<b>Map Selection</b> June 25 ✓	Map selected All maps must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption.
<b>Map Adoption</b> July 23	Map adopted via ordinance or resolution. Election sequencing decided. Final map must be posted at least 7 days prior to adoption.

# Districting Rules and Goals

## 1. Federal Laws

**Equal Population**  
**Federal Voting Rights Act**  
**No Racial Gerrymandering**



## 2. California Criteria

*In prioritized order:*

1. **Geographically contiguous**
2. **Avoid division of neighborhoods and “communities of interest”**  
(Socio-economic geographic areas that should be kept together)
3. **Avoid division of Cities and Census Designated Places**
4. **Easily identifiable boundaries**
5. **Compact**  
(Do not bypass one group of people to get to a more distant group of people)

## 2. California Prohibition

“Shall not adopt election district boundaries for the purpose of favoring or discriminating against an incumbent, political candidate, or political party.”

## 3. Other Traditional Redistricting Principles

**Future population growth**

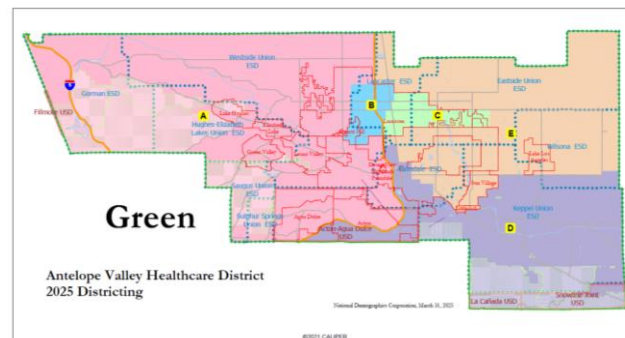
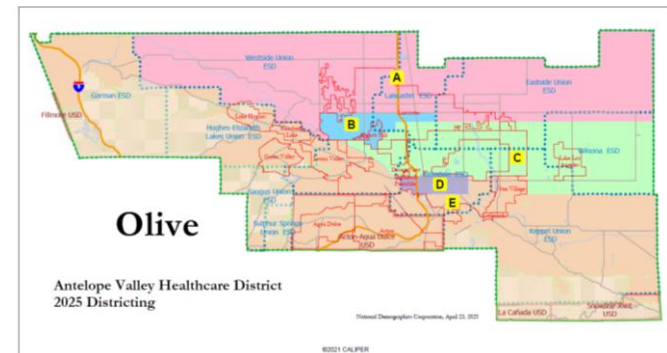
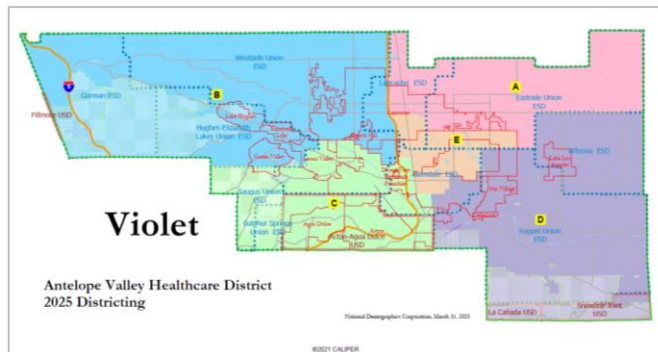
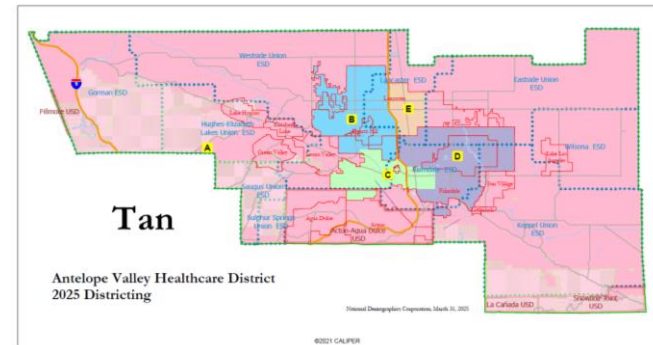
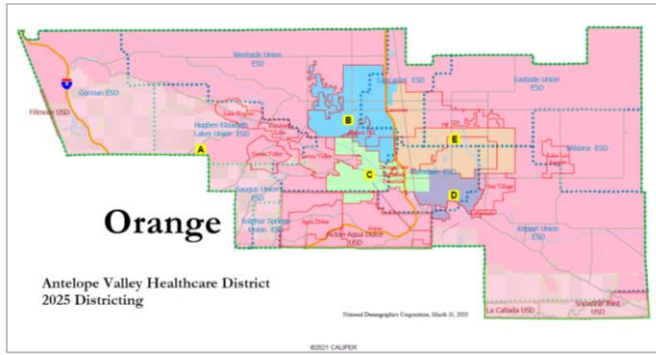

Each of the five divisions must contain about 83,953 people.

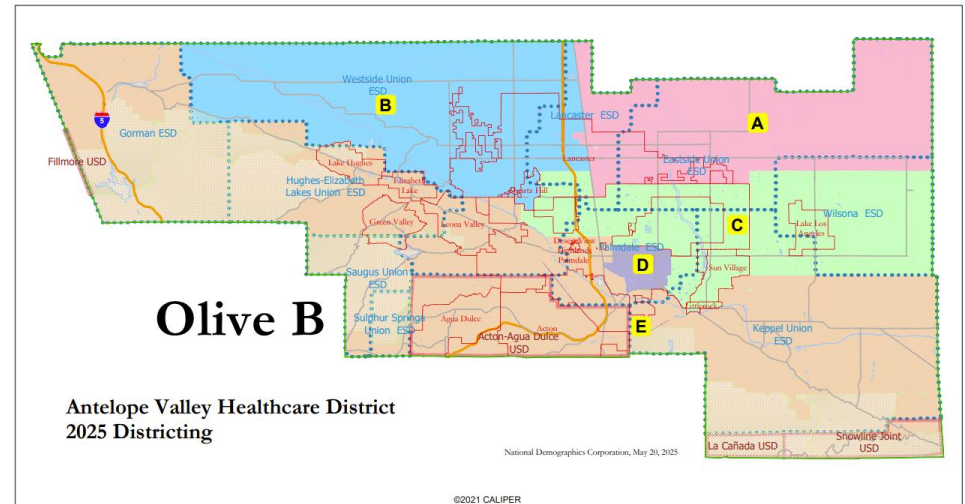
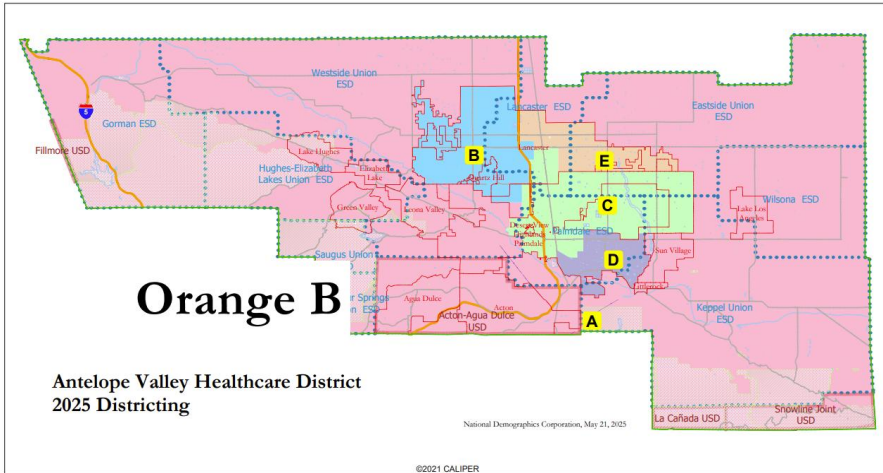

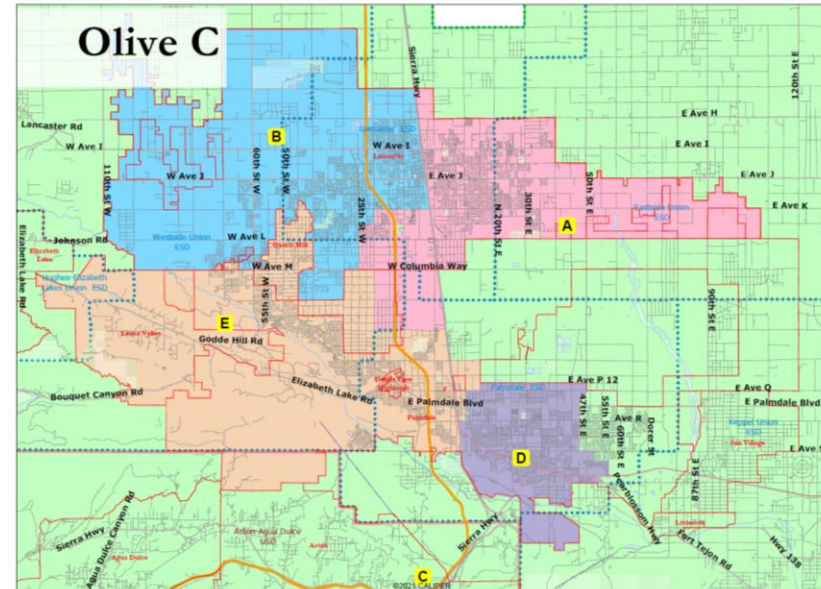
