AV Hospital Receives Grant from Lockheed Martin

ockheed Martin donated \$500,000 to AV Hospital to help with crisis relief due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

This grant will allow AV Hospital to purchase personal protective equipment (PPE) including N95 masks, disposable isolation gowns, Nitrile disposable gloves for employees and ventilators for our patients.

"We are very grateful for this generous contribution that will help AV Hospital acquire muchneeded crisis relief equipment to protect the hospital's front-line workers and our patients," said CEO Ed Mirzabegian. "The generosity from Lockheed Martin is a testament to the community working together through this pandemic."

This funding is especially helpful since the AV Hospital Foundation had to cancel its annual fundraising golf tournament due to the COVD-19 pandemic, which typically brings in thousands of dollars for the hospital.

"As hospitals around the country scramble to secure PPE and ventilators, our Foundation worked tirelessly to secure grants for these supplies," said Johnny Zamrzla, Foundation Board Chair. "Lockheed Martin responded quickly with a very charitable amount, and we are so appreciative

they recognized the need and were able to provide us with this grant."

New specialized equipment could be landing soon at AV Hospital

Several companies around the world are working to develop innovative solutions to help protect those working on the front lines in the fight against the COVID-19 pandemic, and AV Hospital is proud to be working with some of these companies.



Aerospace Valley Positive Pressure Breathing Hood

s part of the newly signed Space Act
Agreement, doctors from AV Hospital have
joined forces with personnel and volunteers
from Virgin Galactic, The Spaceship Company (TSC),
and NASA. The goal of the team is to develop
alternative solutions to help patients suffering from
COVID-19 and the healthcare workers who are
treating them.

First, the team worked together to develop a prototype for an oxygen hood for patients with minor COVID-19 symptoms. The oxygen hood functions as a continuous positive airway pressure (CPAP) machine to force oxygen into a patient's low-functioning lungs. The goal is to provide pressure support and oxygen to patients while at the same time preventing contaminated exhalation from infection healthcare workers.

AV Hospital tested five CPAP hood prototypes, and the team has finalized an optimal CPAP hood design.

The team is taking the design doctors approved and making minor adjustments before seeking approval from the Federal Drug Administration (FDA).

The team is also working on designing a negative pressure canopy to protect healthcare workers while performing procedures on patients positive for COVID-19. The canopy will enclose the COVID-19 patients yet still allow healthcare workers safe access to treat the patients. The negative pressure canopy will protect medical staff by containing and removing infected air through a filtration system, so the air does not contaminate the room.

We are grateful to the dedication and resiliency of this team, and we look forward to seeing these innovations in our hospital and around the world soon.



Hospital is pleased to share that patients with non-urgent needs who do not want to go into the hospital can have their needs met with car side care.

Patients can drive up to a designated parking space near the emergency room. Staff will come to the car to evaluate, register and diagnose the patient. If an X-ray or further testing is needed, the patient can choose to wait in the car instead of in the waiting room for the appointment.

In addition to car side care, we are offering Telehealth follow up visits to anyone discharged from the emergency department, rather than requiring them to return to the hospital.

We have noticed fewer people coming to the emergency department, and it can be detrimental

to some patients' health if they wait too long to seek medical attention. AV Hospital has the capacity to treat patients for all ailments, and we have set up separate areas for treating those with COVID-19. We encourage everyone to seek emergency medical treatment for symptoms such as chest pain, difficulty breathing, trouble lifting your arms and weakness, and injuries including broken bones.

AV Hospital is in need of blood donations

e'd like to thank those in our community who have donated blood over the past few months. There is still an urgent need for blood donations at AV Hospital and we encourage those who can donate to do so. Donations are down as people shelter-in-place during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, but giving blood is essential and you are allowed to leave home to do so.

"As the only Level 2 Trauma Center in the region, we must maintain an adequate blood supply for our patients," said CEO Ed Mirzabegian. "We urge those who are healthy and able to please donate at this time."

The AV Hospital Blood Donor Center is complying with guidelines set by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), such as spacing chairs six feet apart, moderating the number of donors in the Center at one time, adhering to thorough cleaning practices and encouraging people to make appointments ahead of time instead of walking in to donate.

Giving blood is safe, easy and takes less than an hour. A person must be at least 17 years old, weigh 110 pounds or more (16 years old with written parent/guardian consent and weigh 120 pounds or more), be in good health (no colds, flu, infections or unstable health conditions) and not have given blood in the last eight weeks. First time donors must present a picture ID (driver's license or state ID card).

If you're interested in donating, please make an appointment ahead of time to help us control the number of donors in the center and to maintain social distancing. You can schedule a time by calling 661-949-5622. The AV Hospital Blood Center is located on the 3rd floor of the Antelope Valley Outpatient Imaging Center, 44105 15th Street West, Suite 305.
